PURSUANT to an ACT of the GENERAL ASSEMBLY passed the 16th of March, 1783, We, the COMMISSIONERS of the TREASURY, have this day delivered to

Mr. Drury Goins

this our INDENTED CERTIFICATE for the Sum of *Eighteen pounds six Shillings and eight pence three farthings Sterling. Militia Duty in 1781 & 1782 & Land's Account Audited*

the said *Drury Goins* his Executors, Administrators, or Assigns will be entitled to receive from this Office the Sum of *One pound five Shillings & three pence Sterling* on the *demand* for one Year's Interest on the Principal Sum of *Eighteen pounds six Shillings and eight pence three farthings Sterling* and the like Interest Annually *from the 1st of the Genl. Assembly 1783*

The said *Drury Goins* his Executors, Administrators or Assigns, will be entitled also to receive, and shall be paid, if demanded, the principal Sum of *Eight pence three farthings* on the *Twenty sixth day of January* And the said *Drury Goins* his Executors, Administrators, or Assigns, may make any Purchases at any Public Sales of Confiscated Property, (except such as shall be ordered by the Legislature for special Purposes;) and this INDENT shall be received in Payment.

For the true performance of the several payments in manner abovementioned, the PUBLIC TREASURY is made liable, and the FAITH of the STATE pledged by the afore said ACT.

GIVEN under our Hands at the TREASURY OFFICE, in CHARLESTON, the *Twenty sixth* Day of *January* one thousand seven hundred and eighty *five*
