

Colonel Phillips'
testimony relating
to the Death of Daub
Head who was killed
on the 9th Instant Aug.
1804.

High water August 15th 1804

Sir

The following is a statement of a conversation that took place between my self & several persons residing in the Cherokee nation &c

George Sanders observed that the Indians were much displeased with Doublehead and Cheslom and that he expected they would be killed as it had been concluded on by a number of the leading characters of the nation and that Doublehead would be called to an account at the Bucking, I observed to him that it would be improper for them to act so rash, that if they considered them selves injured they ought to apply to Callo.

Megs ~~who~~ who was their agent, and I had no doubt but he would have justice done them, he said that he believed Callo meg to be as bad as them meaning Doublehead & Cheslom —

On coming to David Macenriley he informed me that Doublehead was killed and that prior

to his death he had killed a nother man, I asked
him if that was the Cause of his being killed he
answered me no, that the man that killed him
did not now that Double head had killed
oney person that it had been previously
determed on, and that a man called the
Ridey was appointed to Execute the Burm
and went prepared for that Burm
John Rogers also informed me that the
man that killed Double head did not now
that Double head ~~had~~ had killed a ny person
and that Double head throwed out the
priming out of his pistol before he shot
the man and that he was convinced that he
did not mean to kill him but to scare him
I do Certify the above to be a true statement
